By presenting seemingly plausible concerns they con well-meaning people into joining groups unaware of their underlying aims. I urge people to be wary of what they

Activist groups operating in this area oppose all use of animals and the tactics of misinformation across the world have altered consumer behaviour.

This tactic has all but destroyed international markets for kangaroo leather and meat. Consequently we no longer harvest our sustainable quota. Numbers have exploded, drought has driven them ever further south, they progressively denude farms and rangelands, inflict enormous environmental damage and eventually die a cruel death

Aussie Farms are just the latest protagonists. Even their name is grossly misleading: Anti Aussie Farms would be more descript. They would destroy farming if they could and I am pushing for them to lose their tax-free status.




